### "A Date That Will Live In Infamy"

On December 7, 1941, the Empire of Japan, launched a military attack, on the US Naval Base at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, at 0748 am, Hawaii time. The US was a neutral country at the time of the attack. Out of 8 battleships at Pearl Harbor, all were damaged, 4 sunk. 3 cruisers, 3 destroyers, and 180 aircraft were destroyed. 2403 Americans were killed, 1178 wounded during the attack. Japan declared war upon America, shortly after the attack. On December 8<sup>th</sup>, US Congress declared war upon Japan. On Dec. 11<sup>th</sup>, Japan's allies, Germany and Italy declared war upon the US, which was quickly followed with a US response of war declared upon Germany and Italy.

ODVS Announces Sunset of Ohio Veterans Bonus

On Aug., 30, 2021 — the United States officially ceased its military involvement in Afghanistan. As a result, the Ohio Veterans Bonus program associated with the Afghanistan Conflict, which the Ohio Department of Veterans Services (ODVS) administers, is nearing its completion.

Through the support of **Ohio Governor Mike DeWine** and the State Legislature, a \$9.5 million measure was included in the state's recently enacted biennial budget in order to sustain the program, which will sunset in one year. The Office of Budget and Management (OBM) authorized that transfer to our agency.

These funds will ensure that ODVS can make a rigorous final push to pay every eligible veteran — including those who may have been denied payment because of correctable technicalities or other impediments. The money total is based on Department of Defense deployment figures and the number of applicants and payouts that already have been made to Ohio veterans.

The Ohio Veterans Bonus program offers a bonus for those who served in the U.S. Armed Forces after October 7, 2001. Once a veteran has received \$500 for service anywhere in the world or \$1,000 for service in a designated country, or the maximum \$1,500 bonus, the veteran is not eligible for additional funds, even if they served in multiple conflicts. Those service members who completed their deployments in Afghanistan and have not yet applied for the Ohio Veterans Bonus can do so up until <u>Aug. 30, 2024.</u> Apply for your bonus today: www.ohiovets.gov/veteransbonus Charles Cleves / Service Officer We are here for you!

# <u>POST 318 CHARITIES. INC. LOOKING</u> <u>EXPAND CONTROL BOARD</u>

One of your first questions you may ask, if you are not currently actively involved in your Post's activities and make up, is "what and who is Post 318 Charities, Inc?". To make the explanation as short and simple as possible, Post 318 Charities, Inc. (C.I.) is the entity, which is a separate 501-c-3 corporation, which provides funds for Post 318's Legion and Post programs approved by the Post 318 Executive Committee. C.I. gets its funds from several sources such as Poppy Days, a percentage of 501-c-3), and other fundraisers, as well as direct donations. If Post 318 C.I. did not exist, any Post 318 fundraising activities such as Bingo, where the percentage required to go to a 501-c-3, would have to go the Legion's Department of Ohio C.I. or some other established 501-c3 with Post 318 receiving no benefit from it, or having any control as to its usage. Now for topic of this item. Post 318 C.I. has its own Articles of Incorporation, and By-Laws, chartered by Ohio in 2011. Post 318 C.I. Is currently governed and controlled by a five (5) member Board of Trustees. Currently the Board consist of three (3) Post 318 Members (Don Bishop, Walt Geil & Dan Wolfangel) and two (2) non-Post members (Donna Prues & Lisa Banks). The currant By-Laws permit the Board, at their discretion, to expand to seven (7) Trustees. The C.I. Board at its recent Quarterly Meeting, discussed consideration of increasing the members of C.I. Board to the maximum permitted, with at least one being a member of Post 318, and the second being either a Post Member or non-Post member person. Anyone interested in being considered for appointment as a C.I. Board Member, or wishing more detailed info, should feel free to contact one of the existing Post Members on the C.I. Board of Trustees.
