"Brief" History of the American Revolution

After the British imposed a Stamp Act on the colonies in 1765, the 13 colonies, claiming taxation without representation, claimed their independence from Great Britian, which eventually led to the formation of the United States of America. On June 11, 1776 the Continental Congress created a formal Declaration of Independence, which was adopted by 12 of the 13 colonies, on July 4th 1776. The American Revolution lasted from 1775-1781 and after many battles, the British surrendered at Yorktown, VA. on October 19, 1781. American deaths during the Revolution is listed as 25,324, which was 10% of the colony population at the time.

ODVS Announces Sunset of Ohio Veterans Bonus.

On Aug. 30, 2021 — the United States officially ceased its military involvement in Afghanistan. As a result, the Ohio Veterans Bonus program associated with the Afghanistan Conflict, which the Ohio Department of Veterans Services (ODVS) administers, is nearing its completion.

Through the support of **Ohio Governor Mike DeWine** and the State Legislature, a \$9.5 million measure was included in the state's recently enacted biennial budget in order to sustain the program, which will sunset in one year. The Office of Budget and Management (OBM) authorized that transfer to our agency.

These funds will ensure that ODVS can make a rigorous final push to pay every eligible veteran — including those who may have been denied payment because of correctable technicalities or other impediments. The money total is based on Department of Defense deployment figures and the number of applicants and payouts that already have been made to Ohio veterans.

The Ohio Veterans Bonus program offers a bonus for those who served in the U.S. Armed Forces after October 7, 2001. Once a veteran has received \$500 for service

anywhere in the world or \$1,000 for service in a designated country, or the maximum \$1,500 bonus, the veteran is not eligible for additional funds, even if they served in multiple conflicts. Those service members who completed their deployments in Afghanistan and have not yet applied for the Ohio Veterans Bonus can do so up until <u>Aug. 30, 2024.</u>

ATTENTION ALL VETERANS OF POST 318

Did you know <u>veterans</u> are entitled to be buried or have their ashes interred in any <u>National Cemetery</u> that has available space at no charge? Currently, the <u>Veterans</u> <u>Benefits Administration (VBA)</u> operates <u>125</u> <u>national</u> <u>cemeteries</u>, of which 65 are open for new casketed interments, and 21 are open to accept cremated remains only. Burial options are limited to those available at a specific <u>cemetery</u> but may include an in-ground casket or interment of cremated remains in a columbarium, the ground, or a scatter garden.
