### Post Finance Report for 5/26/2021

After a determination that we were paying twice the Anderson Township aggregation rate for electricity, I terminated the contract with American Power and Gas (APG). We have signed up with Dynergy, the approved carrier for Anderson Township, and we should see our bills going down in July. We should see a reduction this month as Duke's rate is 6.6 versus the 11.5 that APG was charging us for. The new aggregation rate is 4.98. There was no termination fee. **The May Finance Report:**

### **Formation of a "Sons of the American Legion (S.A.L.) Squadron"????**

At the February 24<sup>th</sup> Executive Committee Meeting, the E.C. authorized the exploration into the formation of a Post 318 S.A.L. Squadron. Thus, we are seeking information as to whether any of our membership's sons would be interested in joining a Post S.A.L. Squadron, should such be formed.

The S.A.L. was created in 1932, as an organization within the American Legion that exists to honor the service and sacrifice of Legionnaires. The S.A.L. is made up of males all male descendants, adopted sons and stepsons of veterans of all ages whose parents or grandparents served in the U.S. Military and were eligible for membership in the American Legion.

To form such a Post 318 unit requires a minimum of at least ten (10) eligible males to serve as Charter Members of the Squadron. Should it be determined that we have sufficient volume of interest, we will conduct an “Informational / Orientation Meeting” for all interested to attend to determine if we can move forward with the formation.


### "Help22"

### **Memorial Day, 2021!**

On Memorial Day, Monday – May 31<sup>st</sup>, Anderson Post 318 resumed their long-standing practice of conducting memorial ceremonies at nine local cemeteries in honor of those military veterans laid to rest at those locations. The brief memorial service at each cemetery included the placing of small American flags and flowers on the representative veteran's graves, the firing of a three round volley "salute to the dead" by the Post's Rifle Squad, and playing of "Taps" by Post 318's buglers.

### **Post Scholarship Awards**

The E.C. has voted to permit the awarding of up to six (6) scholarships, utilizing the following award breakdown criteria:

One (1) to Three (3) Awards at \$1,000 each / Four (4) awards at \$750 each / Five (5) Awards at \$600 each / Six (6) awards at \$500 each, with total accumulative amount of all scholarships within a given year not exceeding \$3,000. The decision on number of individual scholarships to be awarded within this set criteria, within a given year, shall be at discretion of Veteran Scholarship Committee Chair.

This revision will be added to the Post 318 Business Plan, and we request that Charities, Inc. to do the same with their Business Plan for 2021-2022.

### "IN SEARCH OF A POST ADJUTANT "

We are currently moving ahead into the new 2021-2022 membership year, without having elected one of the major Post Officer positions, that of Post Adjutant. I am not saying that merely because I currently serve, and have served in that position since July 2004, a total of almost 16 years years, with one break of about 15 months when Ed Ruffennach served, and I served as his Assistant Adjutant until his death, in late 2020, when I was appointed to serve the balance of his term.

The American Legion requires each Post to have a Commander and an Adjutant to maintain it's charter. We have tried over the past few months to find someone to serve as Assistant Adjutant to "learn the ropes" in preparation to run in this last election, however our efforts have gone unanswered. I have noted here an excerpt from the Post Business Plan: "The Adjutant shall have charge of and keep a full and correct record of all proceedings of all meetings, keep such records as the Department and National Organizations may require, render reports of membership annually or when called upon at a meeting, and under direction of the Commander handle all correspondences of the Post. Other responsibilities of the Adjutant include, but are not limited to:

- 1) Chairs the Internal / External Communications Committee (see Standing Committee Responsibilities)
- 2) Maintains membership records in cooperation with membership Chairperson.
- 3) Records and maintains meeting minutes.
- 4) Publishes and posts official orders, announcements, instructions, and various articles of correspondence as necessary.
- 5) Maintains custody of all Post records.
- 6) Maintain a copy of the Post Adjutant's Manual.
- 7) Has primary access to the Post mailboxes (and distribution of all Post mail)."

I am hoping there is someone within our membership who will step up and assume the responsibilities of Post Adjutant. This is necessary to assure that American Legion – Anderson Post 318 will continue to serve our veterans and our community. Please volunteer to serve as Assistant Adjutant in preparation to assume the role.

I will be willing to discuss the Adjutant responsibilities with any members interested in serving Post 318 in the position, and I am also willing to continue in an Assistant Adjutant role for a period of time to assist a new Adjutant in training.
