World War 1 ended on the 11th hour, 11th day, of the 11th month, On Nov. 11, 1918. Armistice was declared for WWI. On Nov. 19, 1919, Pres. Wilson proclaimed November 11th as Armistice Day. In 1954, after lobbying by veteran's organizations, congress amended Armistice Day to Veteran's Day, which was signed into legislation by Pres. Eisenhower on June 1, 1954. In 1975, Pres Ford signed into law, that Veteran's Day will be observed each year on November 11th. Veteran's Day pays tribute to all American veteran's, living or deceased, who served our country honorably.
