VETERAN'S DAY – NOVEMBER 11TH

Veteran's Day originated as "Armistice Day" on November11, 1919, the first anniversary of the end of World War I. It was the 11th hour, of the 11th day, of the 11th month. Congress passed a resolution in 1926 for an annual observance, and November 11 became a national holiday beginning in 1938. Unlike Memorial Day, Veteran's Day pays tribute to all American Veterans, living or dead, but especially gives thanks to living Veterans who served their country honorably during war or peacetime.

NOVEMBER BIRTHDAYS

HAPPY 250TH BIRTHDAY - US MARINE CORP

On November 10, 1775, in the dimly lit confines of Tun Tavern in Philadelphia, the Continental Congress gave birth to what would become the mightiest fighting force the world has ever known - the United States Marine Corps. That fateful day marked the beginning of an unbroken chain of valor and sacrifice that continues to this day, as each generation of Marines adds its own chapter to our Corps' illustrious history.

Legion Post 318 will be having our cake ceremony on Monday, November 10th, 2025 at 7:00 pm or (1900). All post members are invited to watch our Marine Veteran's hold this ceremony and enjoy some cake after! Hope to see you all there!

The Marine Corps birthday cake is a key part of the annual Marine Corps Birthday Ball, which is a formal ceremony held on November

10th. The cake-cutting ceremony, which has been a tradition since the 1930s and was formalized in 1952, symbolizes the passing of tradition from the oldest to the youngest Marine.

How it started

- Early traditions: The first known cake cutting ceremony was held in 1937 at Marine Barracks, Washington, D.C., featuring a cake shaped like the historic Tun Tavern, the birthplace of the Corps.
- **Formalization:** The ceremony was officially formalized in 1952 by Commandant Lemuel C. Shepherd, Jr., who provided a standardized outline for the cake ceremony.
- Official recognition: The cake cutting ceremony was added to the Marine Drill Manual in 1956.

The ceremony's significance

- **The first slice:** The first piece of cake is traditionally given to the Guest of Honor.
- The oldest and youngest: The second piece is given to the oldest Marine present, who then passes it to the youngest Marine present, symbolizing the passing of experience and tradition from one generation to the next.
- **The sword:** The cake is traditionally cut with the Mameluke sword, a reminder of the Corps' warrior tradition.
- The USMC celebrates 246 years of service to its nation - Marines.mil
 - Nov 9, 2021 While the first cake ceremony is unknown, the first on record took place at Marine Barracks, Washington, D.C., in 1937.

Spotlight Member of the Month – Ed Sears

This month, American Legion Post 318 proudly shines the spotlight on longtime member Ed Sears — a dedicated Veteran, loyal Legionnaire, and all-around great guy who has been part of our Post family for 34 years. Ed served in the United States Air Force for four years, achieving the rank of E-4. His service took him to several locations including Wright-Patterson SAC, Utapao Air Force Base in Thailand, and Little Rock Air Force Base, with a six-week TDY to Howard AFB in Panama. As an Air Frame Repairman/Specialist, Ed's work was hands-on and essential — performing sheet metal and fiberglass repairs on aircraft, forming replacement tubing, and making cables to replace broken ones. His favorite memory from his service days? Spending time at the NCO Club, where camaraderie and good times were always part of the experience. A Cincinnati native and 1968 graduate of Amelia High School, Ed's roots run deep in our community. His parents once owned a carryout and lawn mower business where the Olive Garden now stands on Beechmont Avenue a well-remembered local spot for many years. In civilian life, Ed brought the same dedication to his Legion service, holding several key positions over the years including House Manager, Post shopper, and Bingo Manager for more than 10 years. He is credited for keeping the Legion and Charities, Inc. wellfunded through the successful Bingo program he managed — a contribution that continues to benefit the Post and community to this day. These days, Ed enjoys retirement life with his wife Carolyn, spending his time wood working, playing golf, and watching documentaries. He's a fan of cheeseburgers, the colors red and blue, and fondly remembers his travels to Pattaya Beach, Thailand, as one of his favorite destinations. When asked about memories that stand out. Ed recalls exactly where he was when Neil Armstrong landed on the moon — in a house on the west side of town, watching history unfold and in one unforgettable (and slightly nerve-wracking) memory from his service, he remembers being in a B-52 near Bombay on a work order and seeing a man in

a hangar tapping on a nuclear bomb with a ball-peen hammer! Luckily, it ended safely — and makes for quite the story today. We're proud to honor Ed Sears this month for his dedicated service to both his country and Post318. Thank you, Ed, for your years of commitment, craftsmanship, and camaraderie!
