HAPPY 250th BIRTHDAY – U.S. NAVY

The Continental Congress authorized the fitting out of ships on October 13, 1775, which led to the establishment of the Marine Committee. This committee then sent the first Continental Squadron to sea. The purpose of this squadron, commanded by Esek Hopkins, was to capture munitions. The Continental Navy consisted of approximately 60 ships. After the American Revolution, the Continental Navy was disbanded, and its ships were sold. Later, the destruction of U.S. commerce by Barbary pirates led Congress to authorize the building of six frigates in 1794 and to establish the Navy Department on April 30, 1798.

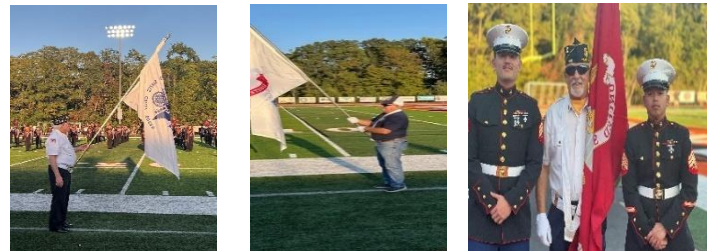

If a veteran was wounded in a firefight, he must highlight the details of the battle. Yellow highlighters seem to work best. Like a moth to a flame, raters are drawn to bright colors.
